Abound WordUp word of the week: RESOURCE

<u>How was this word chosen?</u> This is an academic word, the kind of word that takes *lots* of exposures to learn, and that children will need to know to read texts successfully in the years to come.

The Abound app gives your child 7 opportunities to hear and use the week's abstract word. For extra practice, here are 3 more questions about this week's word, **RESOURCE**.

(RESOURCE definition: a supply of something that we need; something that is useful to us.

- 1. If your only **RESOURCES** were a blanket, a filled water bottle, and three granola bars, could you sleep overnight in the woods?
- 2. **NATURAL RESOURCES** are things that the Earth makes, that people use. Trees are a NATURAL **RESOURCE**, and so is water. Do you know which NATURAL **RESOURCES** we use to keep our house or apartment warm? How does it get to us?
- 3. If you wanted to know what the weather was going to be like tomorrow, what RESOURCES are available that could give you that answer? Which of those RESOURCES is easiest or quickest to use, and which gives you the most information?

This week's featured *TalkOn* question to inspire more TALK at home:

Do you think dogs can tell the difference between different languages? If two people took care of a dog and one spoke English and one spoke Spanish, would the dog understand both people?
