RE: Records Request for Emails Regarding Request to Retire the AB Colonials Mascot

Subsequent to the school committee decision to retire the Colonial as the AB Mascot on October, 15, 2020, we received a public records request from one of our citizens. Specifically, the citizen requested copies of the feedback provided to the school committee which contributed to the decision. In response we are providing these records to our community.

This information is included with the meeting materials of the October 15, 2020 School Committee meeting. It was at this meeting that, after much deliberation, the School Committee members unanimously voted the following:

"To retire the AB Colonial Mascot, recognizing that there are many positive attributes of our town history that we associate with the students of ABRSD, and with the understanding that programs and new purchases made by the District will no longer bear the name "Colonials", but changes to existing capital items such as uniforms, scoreboards and other items will be undertaken as time and funding permit."

More information is found in the posted minutes of that meeting and the recording on actonty.org.

Chairperson Tessa McKinley's memo on the next page describes the events leading up to her request for public input regarding the retirement of the mascot. This memo seeking public comment, was sent to school families, junior high and high school students, all school staff, many alumni and booster groups, and was posted in the Beacon.

The emails that follow are in response to Chairperson McKinley's memo. Specifically, the emails presented here were sent to the School Committee (abrsc@abschools.org) between October 15, 2020 and September 17, 2020 regarding the mascot request. Due to the size of the files, the emails are available in 3 pdf documents, generally in chronological order with the most recent first. Current students' names, email addresses and identifying information was redacted. All other email addresses, home phone numbers and addresses were also redacted.

Thank you to everyone who took the time to share their thoughts on the AB Mascot decision. We recognize that there were very diverse opinions on changing the mascot and the school committee decision was satisfying for some, and frustrating for others. We hope that in the coming weeks and months, our community can begin to feel relief from the difficult dialog during the process. More information about the process that will be used to determine a new mascot will be available in the coming weeks.

Members of the Acton and Boxborough Communities,

The Acton-Boxborough Regional School Committee is welcoming public comment as it considers a petition to retire the Colonial as the official mascot of the District.

On September 17, 2020, the Acton-Boxborough Regional School Committee heard from a student group, AB Students for Equity and Justice (ABSEJ), who recently submitted a petition to the Committee requesting consideration to retire the Colonial as the official mascot of the High School and District. Last Spring, the petition garnered over 1,300 signatures supporting this change. At our meeting on September 17, ABSEJ presented their case for this change which included a letter which was supported by many notable individuals and groups in our community including: Senator Jamie Eldridge, Racial Justice for Black Lives, Educators Committed to Anti-Racist Equity and Social Justice (ECARES), Fostering Racial Justice Boxborough, First Parish Church of Stow and Acton, Unitarian Universalist Church, Angel Youth Foundation, Indivisible Acton, and Highrock Covenant.

In their letter to the Committee, ABSEJ noted "a white-male-colonist mascot in no way reflects the ever-changing community of Acton-Boxborough. As the community grows and diversifies, our current mascot is not representative of who we are or what we stand for as a community." The petition submitted last Spring further noted, "Although mascots intend to bring fan bases together, the AB mascot gives a likeable face to a time period that set the stage for present day racial divisions. Changing the mascot is an ethical and educational action that will underscore the need to know real, and not sugar coated, representations of the past."

The Committee recognizes that the Acton-Boxborough community includes many members and groups who may have a variety of views on the issue before the Committee. The School Committee will deliberate on the petition again and consider action at its meeting on October 15, 2020. We invite the public to submit comments in writing by **Wednesday**, **October 14th** by emailing us at abrsc@abschools.org. While we recognize that public comment is not a vote, we are interested in hearing a variety of opinions on changing the mascot to help make our deliberation more meaningful.

Dear Acton-Boxborough Regional School Committee Members,

I write to express my support for the Acton Boxborough Regional School District (ABRSD) changing the name of the school district's mascot, the Colonials, and for the Acton-Boxborough Regional School Committee to consider allowing the current student body to decide whether to change the school mascot.

As a proud graduate of the Acton-Boxborough public schools, including the Acton-Boxborough Regional High School (ABRHS), where I played junior varsity soccer, freshman, junior varsity and varsity basketball, and served in leadership positions in school government, ABCO, the school yearbook, and the AB Spectrum newspaper, I am deeply grateful for the public education that I received, and remember well the school spirit that surrounded the schools' academics, sports teams, student group, and student activities.

Until this past summer, I blithely accepted our school mascot, the Colonials. Three things happened that opened my mind to consider whether the school district should change its mascot. First of all, after the murder of Minnesota Black resident George Floyd set off racial justice and Black Lives Matters protests across the country, including in the Senate district that I represent, I gained a greater awareness of the need to take every possible action to address racial injustice in our country.

Second, in response to the outrage over glaring racial injustices that continue in our country, some off the founders of AB Students for Equity and Justice (ABSEJ) reached out to me, to discuss their ideas about addressing racial injustice in Acton and Boxborough, including the Acton-Boxborough public schools. In an era where especially white elected officials, community leaders and institution executives need to be more aware of the concerns, requests, and visions of people of color, I felt it was my responsibility to be responsive to ABSEJ's specific requests, especially in light of our conversations about systemic racism that they have experienced in the Acton-Boxborough public schools.

Third, since this summer there has been growing momentum around legislation filed by some of my colleagues, to change the school mascots across Massachusetts that portray Native Americans in a negative or stereotypical light. That creates a greater focus on the symbolism of the Colonials, given

the direct and often violent interactions between English refugees who arrived in the land that later would become the Commonwealth of Massachusetts, and indigenous people and tribes.

As the School Committee deliberates on the school mascot, the Colonials, I would respectfully ask the committee to reflect about the word "Colonial," from a few perspectives.

1. Colonial – before American Independence

As an Acton resident who grew up in Acton, early on I had a sense that the Colonials was of course about Acton residents' critical role in the American Revolutionary War, including Captain Isaac Davis, the first American officer killed in the American Revolution. However, "Colonial" in the context of New England, is not restricted to the men and women of New England who decided to separate from Great Britain, beginning in the mid-18th century. The colonization of New England by mostly English settlers, and therefore loyal to England, spanned from 1620 to 1776. If Acton and Boxborough residents are identifying, whether through their town government, or public schools, as "Colonials," is that celebrating a group of people who did not have full self-government, and remained loyal to the Kings and Queens of England? And let's not forget, that when some English colonists decided that they wanted to be independent of Great Britain, that there were other colonists who remained loyal to the British Crown.

2. Colonial – a global perspective.

The English Pilgrims of the early 17th century were of course just one group of colonists in world history. Nations (mostly European) across the globe were colonizing other regions of the world from the 15th century through the 20th century. Putting aside the colonists of Massachusetts, are the people who are from nations that were colonized and eventually became independent in the past 500 years, does having a school mascot "Colonial" have much of a positive ring to it? Do people in China today have good memories of Japan colonizing parts of China? What is the legacy of the British colonization of India? Are there no more hard feelings between the nations of Spain and Portugal, and most South American countries? What about the continued analysis of the impact of colonists from Germany, France, Great Britain, and Portugal on most African nations? The Acton and Boxborough of 2020, and especially their schools, are celebrated as educational institutions that people not just from across Massachusetts or other parts of the U.S., but around the world, come to live here, because of how great the schools are. Does the term "Colonial" roll off the tongue of many residents, and especially the youth of Acton and Boxborough, who have settled down in Acton and Boxborough over the past 30 years, compared to when I grew up in Acton? Isn't that something that we should all care about, no matter when we came to be Acton or Boxborough residents?

3. Colonial – the genocide of Indigenous People and Tribes

Putting aside the various conflicts, wars, tensions, and yes, partnerships with Native American tribes and English colonists since 1620, I hope there is an awareness of how Indigenous people were treated. Two separate passages:

1. Deer Island: A History of Human Tragedy Remembered

From India Country Today, August 23rd, 2013

In October, 1675 (Just five months after the start of the King Philip's War, 1675-1676) some 500 Nipmucks from what is now South Natick were forcibly removed to Deer Island, a barren strip of land off Boston Harbor, as a concentration camp for Indians (later it would become a holding area for Irish immigrants fleeing the Great Famine (1800s), a major hospital (1847), a prison (c. 1882-1988), and now a wastewater treatment facility and national park), was established by the Massachusetts Council that same year. King Philip's War, or Metacomet's Revenge, as it came to be known, was the first large-scale military aggression in the American colonies and the bloodiest conflict between settlers and Indians in 17th century Puritan New England. Without adequate food, clothing, shelter or medicine, the pro-English Algonquian coverts, who had been converted to Christianity by the zealous Congregationalist minister from Roxbury named John Elliot, half of the Indians confined on the Island died of starvation or exposure during their imprisonment; when John Eliot visited them in December, he could only report with horror, "The Island was bleak and cold, their wigwams poor and mean, their clothes few and thin." These were the same Indians who once welcomed the English in 1621 with their Sachem, Massasoit.

2. Mayflower: A Story of Courage, Community, and War by Nathaniel Philbrick

Epilogue: Conscience

"As early as the fall of 1675, they had begun to sail from the coast of New England: the slave ships, It began in September when a Captain Sprague departed from Plymouth with 178 Indians. By July of 1676, Plymouth had formalized the process of removing potentially dangerous Native men and boys by determining that 'no male captive above the age of fourteen years should reside in the colony'.....It has been estimated that at least a thousand Indians were sold into slavery during King Philip's War, with over half the slaves coming from Plymouth Colony alone."

Thank you very much for your consideration and deliberation of this matter, it is one that I believe has real meaning and value, especially in 2020.



Dear Board of Selectmen:

I write to you today as a resident and private citizen of the Town of Acton and not in any official capacity with the Massachusetts General Court. I have lived in town for over a decade and have done my best to make meaningful contributions to our vibrant and increasingly diverse community. I am the proud parent of an Acton-Boxborough Regional High School junior and 2019 alumnus. For the past 25 years I have dedicated my public health social work career to serving individuals and families in our community and across the state.

I am writing to express my disappointment in the vote you took on October 5th as the Acton Board of Selectmen to keep the Colonials as the Acton-Boxborough Regional Schools District (ABRSD) mascot. While the Colonials mascot may be a source of pride for several of you on the Board, it is clear that many of our residents and ABRSD students and alumnae do not share your perspective. Their concerns about the mascot, the role of colonialism in our country's history, and our students' commitment to creating an inclusive, safe, and anti-racist learning environment for all students ought to be given fair and thoughtful consideration. Indeed, this is precisely why the Acton-Boxborough Regional School Committee (ABRSC) has taken the last few weeks to hear the opinions of students, staff, and community members on our students' request to retire the mascot. As was reported in Wicked Local yesterday, the ABRSC has received several hundred individual letters regarding the matter, which will be discussed during the ABRSC meeting this evening.

In taking a position on a matter that is before the ABRSC – an independently elected body that has full authority to take up matters related to school and education policy – I believe that the Board of Selectmen acted outside the scope of the powers and duties of the Board. The powers of the Board as they relate to the ABRSC are described in the Town of Acton Charter and Town of Acton By-Laws and relate to budgets only and not to policy before the ABRSC.

As we strive to create a more inclusive and welcoming community for our immigrant families and families of color (many of whom came from countries that suffered economic exploitation under colonial rule even as late as the 1970s), it is critical that our local leaders engage in active listening and thoughtful discourse. By rushing to take a vote before the comment period was completed and analyzed, the Board of Selectmen's vote lacked due consideration of public opinion, especially input from young residents and residents of color. In addition, the vote of the Board may have influenced public opinion about the issue and may have interfered with the ABRSC's decision-making process.

Our students should be lauded for their close examination of the impacts of European colonialism on Indigenous populations here in the United States as well as on people in African, Asian, and Latin American countries. Our students should be thanked for their righteous compassion in bringing the petition to the ABRSC to retire the Colonials mascot. I believe that we can evolve our understanding of key concepts and retire images that no longer reflect our shared values, while also honestly acknowledging our town's history.

I look forward to learning more from community members tonight and as this conversation progresses.

Subject: Procedural question regarding retirement of JH and HS Mascot.

Dear School Committee Members:

I understand there is a meeting tonight, October 15th, at which the issue of the retirement of the school mascot will be discussed. Without getting into the pros and cons of the issue itself I write to voice my concerns over the process by which you are proceeding. My hope is that whatever decision is being made, it is not tonight, but rather after giving both sides ample opportunity to voice their opinions. In particular, the decision must not be made hastily as the Committee has specifically set forth in its own policies (Section F, File FF, Naming, District Facilities) that:

The Acton Boxborough Regional School Committee believes naming or renaming a school building, structure, space, property, program or other District asset (hereafter referred to as a "Facility") is a matter of significant importance, one that deserves the most thoughtful attention of the School Committee and the Administration, and one that is an unusual occurrence or event. Further, the Committee believes it should not be influenced in its decision by personal prejudice, favoritism, political pressure or temporary popularity. (emphasis added)

The timeline set forth by your own memo of September 24th indicated that you were presented with a petition in the Spring of 2020, then invited the petitioners to speak at your September 15th meeting. The only public opportunity the Committee afforded for receiving other perspectives has been a three week period during which you only invited direct emails, discounting online petitions and comments such as the Change.org petition because you were unable to verify the identity of the people who responded. Ms. Mckinley's subsequent email responses to public inquiries and social media posts suggest that the Committee's invite for public comment to the community was never intended for the purpose of receiving a "vote." Consequently, this causes me to be troubled by your memo to the Committee dated October 13th that not only summarizes the email comments you received, but paints a biased light (perhaps

unintentionally) against those who support to keep the mascot asserting that 79% of the current student and staff support the change. If it was not a vote, then the numbers should have never been published. Rather, the substantive content of the emails should have been shared with the entire Committee solely.

I only emphasize that this process needs to be fair, balanced and done in a manner in which BOTH sides feel as if they have had ample opportunity to present their perspectives. Under the Committee's own policies I believe a screening committee should be appointed "consisting of representatives of *various interest groups*," (emphasis added) before a decision should be made to consider to move forward on the petition to retire the mascot. (See Section F, File FF-R).

The process matters.

I am a graduate of ABRHS (Class of 1997) & while I was originally neutral on the position of changing the mascot, the longer I marinated on the subject, the more change of heart I had.

I wouldn't change one thing about the education that I received at AB - it's part of who I am today. I was a good (not great) student, participated in many clubs & was a varsity letter recipient for my time on the girls swim team.

What I have learned since leaving AB, is that while the school prepared me for post-secondary education, I was very unprepared for the realities of life in the real world. I don't believe that I can be a champion for women's rights, LGBTQ+ rights, immigrants rights, African-American rights, etc., if I ignore the issues with keeping Colonial as our mascot.

ABRHS is advanced is so many ways & one of the best public high schools in a state that has premier education. So, why would we root ourselves in a muddy past (to put it nicely)?

If I had a vote, I would vote to change the mascot from Colonial to something else.

Subject: A-B Mascot Change Dear School Committee Members, I am writing in support of the removal of the Colonial mascot. As a new teacher, I was drawn to the A-B school district because of its commitment to not only celebrate diversity and inclusion but also anti-racism, equity, and social justice. During my first year teaching U.S. History at ABRHS, I interviewed to be an advisor of A World of Difference because the program provides both students and teachers with concrete and effective strategies to address prejudice, name-calling, and bullying when they witness it. This is exactly what ABSEJ, AWoD, and other A-B students are doing by demanding the removal of the Colonial mascot.

Our students are trying to create a community of belonging at A-B by developing an understanding of our community's own biases regarding indigenous peoples, identifying how we can combat such bias and prejudice in our school/community, and establishing a common language so we can be a better ally to the Nipmuc tribe and other Native American tribes.

However, I am increasingly concerned that A-B has made a commitment to be anti-racist but is not willing to be anti-racist in all aspects of the district. Hello,

May I first thank you for your work on behalf of the town and your volunteerism. We can only remain a great community with people giving of their own time and effort and it is appreciated. I also believe that these are times of great stress to so many and heightened emotions can lead to heightened reactions on all issues, I am sure the Colonials name is no exception.

Though I am certainly a former athlete at AB with children in the school today, I also have also led military units of diverse Amercians in combat, coached hundreds of Acton and Boxboro kids of all ethnicity and backgrounds, led hundreds of kids of all backgrounds in Acton Scouts and have volunteered on numerous committees with diverse groups of fellow citizens in the schools and town. In my work as President of a national firm I started and have grown our diversity and inclusion initiatives and am intimately involved in social justice initiatives in and out of work.

In my Veteran's Day Speech given at the town monument a couple of years ago I wrote:

It was from this neighborhood that they marched to the bridge in Concord. We are so proud of those first veterans of Acton. And I believe that if faced with such a clear and present danger today, our community would again line up to defend all that we hold dear. The unit on the march would look very different from the one Isaac Davis commanded in 1775. This one would be filled with women and men, from countries the world over, with diverse backgrounds, hopes, dreams - all willing to defend the idea and place that has always had room and protections for everyone willing to do so. Just amazing.

I want my children to grow up in a more diverse world. I want to celebrate our diversity and work to understand the incredible backgrounds of those in our community. All of that said, I do not believe changing the name "Colonials" achieves the desired positive impact in line with the sentiment above. Dear AB School Committee and Superintendent Light,

It is clear you've received many opinions on the mascot issue, and I've read Tessa McKinley's excellent summary. Nevertheless, I wanted to share one more opinion from a community member, understanding that while we are stakeholders, we are not those most directly impacted,

This academic year we mark 400 years since the Mayflower landed in Plymouth. What a perfect opportunity to examine what it means to be Colonials, and whether or not we wish that to be how we continue to define ourselves as a multicultural community.

As a leader of a community organization that includes AB students, families, and faculty, I wanted to share that our congregation has also been engaging in the work of self-examination related to our colonial legacy. As a congregation that dates back to 1683, our church history is inextricably woven with Colonial history. Indeed, our internal history documents tell us that the church building was built "in the fear of the Lord and of the Indians." This history is part of who we are as a community. That fact cannot be changed. But we can change how we understand it, and how we talk about it, and whether or not we celebrate it. And it is also possible to celebrate a long and proud history and at the same time lament the legacy of colonization and the impact on Native peoples and the connection of it to slavery.

Changing the name of a mascot, of course, doesn't change our history, erase it, or negate it. Nor does it fix all of our problems of oppression, racism, and the legacy of colonization.

But to hold a name as a mascot is about more than simply acknowledging and understanding our history. A mascot is a symbol of who we are as a community, a symbol of those values and traits about ourselves that we are proud of, and even of what we aspire to be. When we choose a mascot we choose something that our gathered community may chant at sports rallies, that we put on t-shirts, that uphold as what is best about us.

So at this point in history, when this issue has been brought before you as deciders in this community, it is about more than saying "this is our history," it is about saying, "this is who we are, this is our source of pride, this is our aspiration." And when looked at it that way, it is clear that the Colonial mascot can no longer represent all of this community, a community that has grown increasingly ethnically and racially diverse, and a community that now has a different understanding of the legacy of colonization than we did when it chose the Colonial.

The board of trustees of my congregation voted to support the Mascot Initiative sponsored by the Acton Boxborough Students for Equity and Justice, upon the advice of our racial justice task force. I also support the voice of the students and faculty who are saying that now is the time for change. I hope you will, too.

The high school theater group, which supports this initiative, is identified as AB Proscenium Circus, even in state competitions, not Colonials. For students who play sports, they are the AB Colonials. They are called the Colonials when battling with the "Patriots" in Concord or the "Warriors" at Lincoln-Sudbury. The sports community at AB largely opposes a mascot change. While the mascot represents all students, the sports community is more impacted by this change. If the mascot is removed, there will be little impact to the students who requested this change. In fact, it will not address racism in America, and it will not suddenly solve our inequity issues either locally or nationally.

Nobody is disputing the early settlers moved into already inhibited land and many treated the Native Americans badly. The colonials were fleeing from an oppressive rule, fighting for survival, but later fought for freedoms and against slavery. All history of Nations have dark aspects. The racist treatment happened in all colonies, but more prevalent outside New England. There are many accounts of colonials in our area living side by side Native Americans and sharing religion. The reason for the change in mascot is due to the initial treatment of the Native American tribes, but ignores the rest of history, which had enormous impact on Acton and our country. Should we remove the stripes on the American flag that represent the 13 original colonies? I understand the urge to make a change in a bad political climate, where racism is an issue nationally, but this petition uses only one aspect of history to help combat a modern day issue.

I wish this issue was handled differently, and all students had a voice early in the process. It has been framed on social media that there is enormous support from the students for this change. This is just not true. The student body is split on their views of changing the Colonial mascot. The petition garnered support over the summer from the local BLM movement and the School Committee, however the students who oppose this never had a voice. The larger community is more likely to support a student led initiative. Equity was one of the reasons for this change, yet this issue wasn't handled equitable for all students, especially the ones directly affected by the change.

My suggestion for a solution or compromise could be to remove the visual of a white-male-colonist and just use the AB symbol to depict the AB Colonials. The actual mascot is rarely a visual during school spirit events or sports. The AB symbol is used on all sports clothing, banners, JH/ABRHS fields and gyms, and not the visual of the white-male-colonist.


To those who say why bother with this initiative: that perspective is a privilege to hold. You cannot police how oppressed groups choose to reclaim their dignity.

The Acton-Boxborough Regional School Committee is welcoming public comment as it considers a petition to retire the Colonial as the official mascot of the District.

On September 17, 2020, the Acton-Boxborough Regional School Committee heard from a student group, AB Students for Equity and Justice (ABSEJ), who recently submitted a petition to the Committee requesting consideration to retire the Colonial as the official mascot of the High School and District. Last Spring, the petition garnered over 1,300 signatures supporting this change. At our meeting on September 17, ABSEJ presented their case for this change which included a letter which was supported by many notable individuals and groups in our community including: Senator Jamie Eldridge, Racial Justice for Black Lives, Educators Committed to Anti-Racist Equity and Social Justice (ECARES), Fostering Racial Justice Boxborough, First Parish Church of Stow and Acton, Unitarian Universalist Church, Angel Youth Foundation, Indivisible Acton, and Highrock Covenant.

In their letter to the Committee, ABSEJ noted "a white-male-colonist mascot in no way reflects the ever-changing community of Acton-Boxborough. As the community grows and diversifies, our current mascot is not representative of who we are or what we stand for as a community." The petition submitted last Spring further noted, "Although mascots intend to bring fan bases together, the AB mascot gives a likeable face to a time period that set the stage for present day racial divisions. Changing the mascot is an ethical and educational action that will underscore the need to know real, and not sugar coated, representations of the past."

The Committee recognizes that the Acton-Boxborough community includes many members and groups who may have a variety of views on the issue before the Committee. The School Committee will deliberate on the petition again and consider action at its meeting on October 15, 2020. We invite the public to submit comments in writing by Wednesday, October 14th by emailing us at abrsc@abschools.org. While we recognize that public comment is not a vote, we are interested in hearing a variety of opinions on changing the mascot to help make our deliberation more meaningful.

My name is Martin Benson. I am a 2006 graduate of ABRHS and served as Student Council President during my senior year as well as a student representative to the School Committee for two years. I am writing to express my support for keeping the Colonial Mascot, but, more importantly, that as a body you act slowly and thoughtfully in reaching a decision. The Colonial has long been a source of pride for our town and our role in American history. Our citizen farmers bravely took up arms against the world's greatest superpower. Their sacrifice on April 19th, 1775, served as a catalyst for the other colonies to take up arms against their colonial oppressor. The success of the American Revolution inspired other countries to fight for their own freedom which led to the end of the colonial era. Captain Isaac Davis, who led the Acton militia, was killed that day at the Concord Bridge. He is buried in the center of town, and the Minuteman on the back of the Massachusetts quarter is his image. His plow is on display inside the entrance of town hall symbolizing Acton's citizen soldiers.

We are living through tense times. Politics has divided our country while a novel pandemic has changed our way of life. The upcoming months and years are going to be long and arduous and our community needs to be brought together not driven apart. In the coming years, Acton will need community support to pay for possible school overrides, projects, scholarships and related expenses. Abruptly retiring a town tradition to satisfy a segment of the community is likely to be short sighted.

What is of great concern to many is the Committee's appearance of rushing to a decision without properly studying this issue and its potential effects. Specifically, statements in Tessa McKinley's October 14th letter suggesting that there is no need for further history lessons as the history has been "misrepresented" is inaccurate, dismissive, and offensive to many community members. Additionally, this statement clearly indicates a lack of historical knowledge and academic curiosity amongst members of this school committee. Furthermore, as the economy continues to falter and budgets grow tighter, the \$218,295 cost to replace team uniforms is not the best use of our resources at this time.

This debate has only divided the town at a time when we need to be united. Thousands of people on both sides have expressed their opinions. Rather than make an abrupt decision, I encourage the School Committee to form an exploratory committee to study this issue. This committee could be composed of students, alumni, teachers, community members, and historians. It's critical that it include a diversity of views in order for all sides to have a seat at the table and hopefully result in a community buy in. After studying the comprehensive history of the town, the committee may reach a conclusion on whether the mascot should be updated and how it could reflect the diverse community that now is Acton.

I encourage committee members to approach this subject with an open mind and to take the time to learn the history of our unique town and its role in the founding of our nation. The Minuteman, who some students find offensive, sacrificed their lives for the town we all live in and inspired others around the world to take up arms against their colonial oppressors. Let's not sever connections to the past, let's add to them. It's best we come to these decisions together.

I am a town resident and a parent of a current / student.

I oppose the petition to retire the "Colonial" as the AB Mascot.

Here are the reasons:

- 1. The current petition is incomplete and does not propose an alternative mascot. If students do not like the mascot they should bring to the table a viable alternative, and have the support for this alternative. Retirement and replacement of the mascot should be a single petition. It cannot be done in multiple steps. It is unfair for the petitioners to leave the problem of selecting a new mascot to others.
- 2. The current petition does not recognize the costs that Acton and Boxborough citizens would have to bear if the mascot retirement petition is approved. There should be a process established to identify related costs and for funding these costs.
- 3. The petition does not adequately address the local context of the mascot origin. The mascot represents specific local origins which are associated with patriotism, bravory, and sacrifice. The petition does not recognize these points.

Finally, the petition has brought up a lot of bullying from supporters of the petition. I have seen open minded, carring, educated members of the community being called "racist" for opposing this petition. I have seen bullying of students who questioned the petition's premis. It should have been a deliberative process for real conversation. Instead, it has been very offensive and

discouraging. The committee should address this and take this into account as you are considering the petition, and counting votes from the community and students.

I totally concur with Mr. Benson's suggestion.


I urge the School Committee to not take a definitive vote to retire the Colonial mascot at this time. More education and discussion on all sides is needed.


I believe it is time to change the mascot **NOT** because I host any hatred toward our history (see below for a picture of me getting recognized at the State House by State Secretary Galvin for my years of volunteering as a summer tour guide at the State House), but because I believe it is time for us as a community to recognize the **TRUTHS** of our history. The Colonial mascot glories one part of U.S. and world history that is only worth celebrating for white people of European heritage; for the rest of us that are Black, Indigenous, and People of Color, it is genocide, colonialism, and the basis for

hundred of years of systemic racism. As we fight for a more inclusive future for all of us, for a future that is truly anti-racist, all symbols of oppression, including the mascot, must go.

Seeing the overwhelming support for the mascot from an **overwhelmingly white** crowd hurts. As a person of color who has a lot of joyous memories of Acton but also a lot of traumas from years of being a person of color and immigrant in a predominately white town, I am really hurt by these white people's general lack of empathy toward the sufferings of their fellow Americans and humans. They are acting like we don't live here or our history/presence don't exist. I am hurt, but not more than I am tired. I have already moved to New York City after college. Seeing everything that has unfolded in this fight to change the mascot only serves as a remainder of why I moved and why I am never coming back.

I'm writing to let you know that Acton Boxborough is crushing the American Dream of a young first-generation immigrant. I'm tired of trying to make my plea palatable to you. Please do the right thing. We are asking for so little.





Dear Members of the Acton-Boxborough Regional School Committee:

In mid-September, you reached out to the community "welcoming public comment as [you] consider a petition to retire the Colonial as the official mascot of the District" following a petition from the Acton-Boxborough Students for Equity and Justice (ABSEJ). Since then, you have received hundreds of responses from concerned citizens, alumni, and current staff and students about whether or not the District should eliminate the Colonial mascot. I certainly don't envy your position as you weigh all of this feedback and consider next steps.

Thinking about this question through the lens of my role in the district as the Assistant Superintendent for Diversity, Equity, and Inclusion, I spent time talking with alumni, students, and colleagues about their thoughts around the mascot (both for and against a change, as Chairperson McKinley challenged the community to do). I also read about the etymology of the word "colonial" (as both a noun and an adjective), articles about school mascot changes in the last twenty years, and new (to me!) sources about New England history.

As a result of this learning, I alternatively framed this debate around a different question: Why should the District keep the Colonial mascot? This brought me to consider this online petition (with nearly 2350 signers) in favor of the existing mascot. As I read the approximately 100 comments posted in support of the Colonial, they seem to fall into two main buckets. The vast majority are from individuals concerned about erasing the "rich history" of the town (specifically Acton). These posts include phrases about "our founding fathers", "brave men", "the creation of the United States," and a handful also likened a potential recall of the mascot to "cancel culture." The second type of comments (mostly from ABRHS graduates/longtime Acton Residents) express a sense of school pride and camaraderie, with some expressing a desire for the Colonial mascot to live "forever." One enthusiastic signer even markets "Heritage, Not Hate" Colonial tee shirts/swag (which technically could fall into either bucket). However, there are a few outliers, including one individual (most certainly a local taxpayer) who wrote, "I better not have to pay for new sports equipment that doesn't [say] Colonials" and two others who simply noted that there isn't a compelling case to change the mascot. Therefore, in response to the question of why the District should keep the mascot, it seems that those in support of the Colonial have basically established two reasons: first, keeping the mascot will ensure that the history of Acton is not erased or forgotten; and second, retaining the Colonial will guarantee that AB students will continue to maintain a sense of pride in their activities, teams, and school/District.

In response to the petitioners' first reason, the notion that keeping the mascot will ensure that Acton's history from its incorporation in 1735 to present day is not erased or forgotten is misguided at best. In this thinking, the Colonial has been

conflated to 'stand for' everything that Acton ever has been and ever will be. When the District was incorporated in 1955, the residents were 99% White. To narrowly constrain Acton's history to a single time period within the Colonial era neglects the amazing diversity represented in Acton's residents today, who are 25% Asian, 3% multi-race, 3% Hispanic, 2% Black, and 70% White¹. Additionally, our students (enrolled in Acton elementary schools) will continue to learn about Acton's history in second grade, and they will learn about it again when it's taught through the lens of the American Revolution in any U.S. History course they take at the high school and beyond. Only now, our educators aim to ensure that they learn a more accurate version of our local history, including the fact that almost all of the thousands of books written about colonial New England conveniently exclude the fact that slavery flourished here, (with Native Americans serving as the primary source of non-white labor²) and that there was at least one slave owner in Acton³. The District is committed to ensuring that the students in front of us today learn non-whitewashed history that is centered around historically marginalized groups, while also including the important roles White male Actonians like Isaac Davis played in the 1700s and beyond.

The second reason petitioners shared for keeping the mascot, that AB students would be able to maintain school spirit is confusing to me. As many of you know, I am an ABRSD alumnae and a District employee. Anyone who visits me in Central Office today can see the place of pride my framed ABRHS diploma and varsity letter have on my wall. Both represent the respect and gratitude I have for our District in its role in shaping who I am today. Neither of these artifacts mention the Colonial mascot, yet the AB "pretzel" logo and District seal clearly represent ABRSD. My decision to engage in high school activities had nothing to do with the Colonials mascot. I didn't join the National Honor Society because I thought it would make me a better Colonial. I didn't cheer for the football team because they were the Colonials. I did these things because I had a sense of school spirit, was proud of being a part of AB, and would do anything I could to support and encourage my peers. We could have had any mascot, and I would have been- and continue to be- immensely proud of my high school, my clubs and activities, and my community.

When the Colonial mascot was gradually adopted by ABRHS teams in the late 1950s, it certainly wasn't chosen to intentionally degrade a person or group, but rather to honor our local history. But today, over sixty years later, there are a number of individuals in our community who are telling you that they find the Colonial mascot offensive. And while some might argue that every mascot in existence may offend someone, the bigger argument is whether keeping the Colonial mascot supports or erodes our District's stated value of inclusion. In my role, I center students in my thinking and decisions. So I think that the question before you is actually one for the students we send out to represent our District in clubs, sports teams, and activities: Are each and every one of you who represent our District proud to wear a uniform with the word "Colonials" embroidered on it? And if that answer is 'no' for even one student, then that should be a compelling enough reason.





Dear Members of the School Committee:

We are members of Educators Committed to Anti-Racism, Equity and Social Justice (ECARES), a cohort at the high school seeking to create a safe and equitable environment for students in all aspects of the educational experience. Accordingly, we are writing to support the Call to Action proposed by AB Students for Equity & Social Justice (ABSEJ) regarding the removal of the Colonials mascot.

As so eloquently stated by ABSEJ in their email to AB Admins dated July 11, 2020, the Colonials mascot does not represent our AB community, whose influence and presence on native lands caused the deaths of hundreds of thousands of Indigenous people. By making this change, the district would be taking real beginning action in direct support of our goal to foster an actively anti-racist school environment. These changes acknowledge the devastating legacy of European exploration, colonization, and exploitation in the Americas, particularly the impacts on Black, Indigenous, and People of Color, who suffered genocide and other grave injustices, and whose descendants continue to experience the effects of structural racism and systemic inequality today, here in our own community as well as all over the country. Since the murder of George Floyd, people around the country have mobilized through the Black Lives Matter movement. We have witnessed the removal of Confederate symbols and statues, the elimination of racist mascots in public schools (including at least three in the Massachusetts school districts of Walpole, Nashoba, Winchester), and policy changes and reform to combat racism in a number of institutions, organizations and industries.

As one of the top school districts in the state, ABRSD must continue to be a model for other districts by doing what is right and just during this defining moment in history. We join ABSEJ in appealing to you to eliminate the use of a mascot that represents racism, ethnic violence, and genocide with the goal of replacing it with one that celebrates the diversity of our community and aligns with our school's values. The school committee has voted to replace the Columbus Day holiday on the second Monday of October with Indigenous Peoples' Day to commemorate the humanity, histories, and cultures of Native Americans, and removing the mascot is in line with this previous committee vote. Thank you for your time.







Dear Acton-Boxborough Regional School Committee Members,

As invited, we, the undersigned, respectfully write in opposition to the petition to the Committee that purports to request the retirement of the official "Colonial" mascot of the High School and District.

John Adams, who was an American statesman from Massachusetts and who served as this country's second president, once proclaimed that the "[a]buse of words has been the great instrument of sophistry and chicanery, of party, faction and division of society." Here, the petition brought forth is exactly that: an abuse of words that seeks to divide a school community. Those that seek to retire the "Colonial" assert that it "sets the stage" for, what they claim, are "present day racial divisions" and is not "representative of who we are or what we stand for as a community." We respectfully disagree. A "colonial" is defined as a "member or inhabitant of a colony". Indeed, to many in this very community, the colonial is a unifying symbol of American resilience, sacrifice and bravery that allows and encourages one to stand up to those who seek to defy liberty and justice for all.

"The name Colonials is being stripped of its own historical meaning and wrongly treated as synonymous with 'colonialism'. Not only were the colonials not a manifestation or celebration of colonialism, they were the very symbol of resistance to colonialism. They fought the British Empire to secure self-rule...[Colonials] are, by definition, the antithesis of colonialism." (Jonathan Turley).

At the beginning of the American Revolutionary War, local colonists, including Captain Isaac Davis, James Hayward and Abner Hosmer, answered the call to arms against the tyrannical and oppressive British and gave the ultimate sacrifice for the very same freedoms which today allow those to submit their petition. The idea that one cannot separate the idea of a "colonial" from certain claimed sinful actions of some colonists is little more than fallacy. Rebranding the school's mascot does nothing to fix the asserted injustices of the past nor does it change

history. Instead, changing the "Colonial" mascot allows only for historical revisionism and seeks to undermine the values under which this community and its schools were founded,

including independence, freedom, preparedness, training, and the willingness to fight against oppression. The Acton-Boxborough Regional School District adopted the "Colonial" mascot when the regional district was established. The "Colonial" is a part of this school district's history, which, significantly, is located at the footsteps of the birthplace of the American Revolution. To many alumni, the "Colonial" represents their legacy of being a part of a resilient student body. Today, for its current students, it cannot be reasonably claimed that cheering for the "AB Colonials" at a sporting event or dressing up in all gold to join the colony of "Crazy Colonials" is tantamount to cheering for or supporting racial divisions. To claim so, is simply an abuse of the word "colonials". Thank you for your consideration.

Dear Acton Boxboro School Committee Members.

This is Robert "Bobby" Abare, a proud graduate of the AB class of 2005 whom also went on to graduate with a BA in Political Science from Yale University in 2009. I write to you with the utmost respect for the Acton-Boxboro school system and a continuation of support for the AB schools and their interscholastic athletic programs and academic progress, Put simply, Acton is one of the best school systems our state has to offer. As far as I know the school continues to perform well and is exceptional in preparing students for college and professional life soon thereafter. I know it was a good and fortunate experience for me to have grown up in Acton and am grateful for the opportunities it has afforded me since.

Though I am now a current resident of the town of Littleton, I am aware of Acton's scholastic and athletic achievements and continue to follow from afar through friends and family members within the town. Though I must admit I do not feel the same connection that I formally did while living in the town for 20+ years, I am nonetheless an steadfast supporter of the student-athletes, the faculty and have family members and friends whom I've kept in touch with or have coached within the towns athletic programs, I am a proud AB alumni who will always have positive remarks about my time in the school system. More recently though, with reference to the history of the school, the Colonial is, in my mind, a symbol of our athletic excellence and all that is good at AB, It's a symbol of the fun athletic programs and the ambitious nature of competition. To change the name would be, in many ways, disrespectful to the many students and student- athletes who felt a symbolic meaning to the Colonial name and we're proud to be an AB Colonial.

Upon further reflection of the meaning of the Colonial and drawing upon my Political Science and historical knowledge, the name can imply Colonialism, or literally "the policy or practice of acquiring full or partial political control over another country, occupying it with settlers, and exploiting it economically." To me, the name "Minutemen" or "Minutewoman" may be a more fitting title for the towns athletic Mascot - particularly revering in a more modern definition, "a person ability to quickly organize and independently serve the greater good of ones community with respect and honor for its citizens and townspeople. To bring together the community for the good of all its people,"

For me, the "Minuteman" or "Minutewoman" definition provided above would seem to provide significance to our towns history while also bringing relevance to today's modern society and the need to have, which the town of Acton already does, an inclusive and an overall, supportive school system. The Minuteman would further strengthen this resolve and a definition, like the one mentioned, would focus on how the Minutemen is focused on bringing the community together,

To Tessa McKinley and the School Committee,

As a proud ABRHS alumni, I am against retiring the Colonial as our dear school's official mascot.
